




The weather in Kanazawa is changeable. Since the city gets a relatively large amount of rain, there is a proverb that translates as "Even if you forget your packed lunch, don't forget your umbrella." 


# Fukatani Hot Spring



This garden originated more than 300 years ago as the garden of the secondary residence of the feudal lord of that time. It is one of the best daimyo gardens, and one of the three most famous gardens in Japan. You can enjoy the Japanese atmosphere of its beautiful landscaping at

#### ■ Kanazawa Castle Park 金沢城公園

Full-scale construction of Kanazawa Castle began more than 400 years ago. Many of its buildings were burned down in repeated fires, but several structures, such as Ishikawa Gate and Saniikken Nagaya, are still standing. Recently, Gojikken Nagaya and some other parts of the castle were restored to their original form. Another attraction of the park is its great variety of stone walls, which cannot be found anywhere else in Japan.

#### [Get to know Kanazawa culture]

#### Nakamura Memorial Museum 由封記今羊術館

The museum has a collection of about 600 pieces, including excellent tea-ceremony works of art and interior furnishings. The collection mainly consists of art/craft objects donated by the Nakamura family, who run a sake brewing company. Some pieces have been designated as important cultural assets. Visitors can enjoy a bowl of powdered green tea while admiring the garden (¥100).

# ⑥Seisonkaku Villa 成異閣

This villa was built about 140 years ago by the 13th lord of Kaga, as a retirement residence for his mother. It incorporates two different styles of architecture. As there are very few daimyo family residences that have remained intact, this villa is highly unusual.

Kanazawa Hyakumangoku Festival takes place in June, with the

main events happening on the first Saturday. The highlight is a

splendid parade that re-creates the Kanazawa of 400 years ago.



[Get a taste of history and literature]

#### ●Ovama Jinia Shrine 犀山神社

This shrine is dedicated to the first lord of Kaga, Maeda Toshiie, Inlaid glass in the uppermost section of the three-tiered gate gives it an exotic appearance. Sever-round free of charge €076-231-7210

#### Maeda Tosanokami-ke Shirvokan Museum 前田土佐守家資料館

This museum displays weapons, art and craft items, letters, etc. belonging to the Tosanokami family, chief vassals of the Kaga clan. Visitors have free access to a lounge facing the small garden, conveniently located for resting after a stroll.

#### ③Shinise Kinenkan Museum 老舗記念館

The Nakaya pharmacy, which was established in 1579, was moved to this location and reconstructed as a museum. It contains furnishings from when the old shop was in business, as well as items that show the merchants' culture of the time.

This facility was built as a base for sightseeing in the Nagamachi area. Everybody is welcome to come in and use the lounge and washrooms, view the exhibits, and obtain tourist information.

#### ⑤Nomura Samurai House 野村家

This is the former mansion site of the Nomura family. For successive generations they were high ranking officials under the Maeda Family. # Korinbo / Kata-machi / Naga-machi and Vicinity

The area that comprises Ishikawa Prefecture, where Kanazawa is located, Toyama Prefecture to the east, and Fukui Prefecture to the west is called Hokuriku. 

## Kanazawa Station / Musashigatsuji / Owari-cho and Vicinity

The glass dome of Kanazawa Station has the nickname of "Motenashi Dome". Motenashi means "welcoming" or "entertainment"; it is a word that indicates good treatment of guests. The dome expresses the hospitality of the citizens of

Omi-cho Market, said to be the "kitchen of the citizens of Kanazawa", is located in Musashigatsuji. About 280 years old, it is crammed with rows of seafood and

Owari-cho, which was once inhabited by merchants and craftsmen, has many old shops that are still in business. You can enjoy the taste of such treats as oldatmospheric street that goes from Owari-cho to the Kazue-machi Chaya District

#### ■Kanazawa Station 金沢駅

The design of 'Motenashi Dome', the symbol of the station's East Plaza, represents an umbrella proffered to visitors to Kanazawa. In front, there is a wooden gate that represents a hand drum. The underground plaza is equipped with Internet terminals, and a large multivision sign that displays a variety of images. This is the place to gather information before going on a trip.

#### [Enjoy a stroll around town]

#### ②Kazue-machi Chaya District 主計町茶屋街

This area near Asanogawa River features a cobblestone street lined with old buildings: high-end Japanese restaurants, bars and inns. Be sure to check out the beautiful glass bench at the nearby Hashiba-cho bus stop!

#### ③Owari-cho area 尾張町界隅

Here you will find many shops that date back to the Edo period, including some with a "one-item mini art museum" display in their storefront.




# The glass dome at Kanazawa Station looks just like a shrine.

# Higashi Chaya District / Utatsuyama and Vicinity

Higashi means "east", utatsu means "east-southeast"; the names of the Higashi Chaya District and Mt. Utatsu (Utatsu-vama) derive from the fact that they are located in an easterly and east-southeasterly direction, respectively, as seen from Kanazawa Castle.

The Higashi Chaya District is one of three chaya districts in Kanazawa. Its streetscape, which has maintained a strong feudal-period atmosphere, is still throbbing with life. For example, in the evening, under the lights of the houses, you might be lucky enough to meet a group of geisha girls. These are not meant as an attraction for tourists; they are definitely one of the sights of modern Kanazawa that have remained throughout the city's long history. The Higashi Geisha District is an area where you can see and experience for yourself the traditional culture of



# Don't forget to make a reservation before going to Myoryuji Temple.

I recommend a visit to Myoryuji Temple, also known as Ninja Temple, which is located in this area. It gives you a chance to see old architecture close up, and the various contraptions in the building will give you one surprise after another. However, there are a couple of points to keep in mind when you visit the temple. First of all, be sure to make a reservation. Also, you should wait until you have been around the building before looking at the English pamphlet. Looking at the pamphlet first would diminish the fun.

#### Kodatsuno / Nodayama and Vicinity

Kodatsuno is southeast of Kenrokuen Garden. There are many temples here too, as well as residential neighborhoods, schools and hospitals; it is a good place for getting a close-up look at the Kanazawa way of life.

Nodayama is an immense cemetery where many figures of historical importance to Kanazawa, such as members of the Maeda family, have been laid to rest. It is said that there are more than 50 thousand gravestones in the cemetery, and many people go there to pay their respects.

This is the family temple of Tama-hime, the princess who came to Kaga in 1601 to marry into the Maeda family. Even now, a wind-up-doll play about the 24-year-long life of Kanazawa's beloved Tama-hime is performed at the temple every day.

From Nodayama, a hill located in the southwestern part of the urban area of Kanazawa, you can see the whole urban area. It is popular as a spot from which to see the city at night; if you have a car, the view is well worth the drive.

The Kodatsuno area is probably the best place to find out about the daily lives of the people of Kanazawa. Because there are a lot of schools in the area, there are many students walking around, and at the bottom of the hill, there is a large shopping center frequented by local residents. 


# ■Map of main Kanazawa bus routes


